Writing:

Research, note take and publish non-fiction report texts. Students will focus on text structure, language features and writing from key words using subtitles/subtopics. Spelling with an emphasis on letter sizing, syllables and dictionary skills (skim reading). Conjunctions: Compound to complex sentences.

Reading and Viewing:

Magic 300 Sight Word List (read and spell)
Literacy through lyrics, weekly poem, weekly big book and daily weather forecast.
Literal and inferred questions.
Grammar – doubling rule for past tense, adjectives, speech marks, compound words and commas in a list.

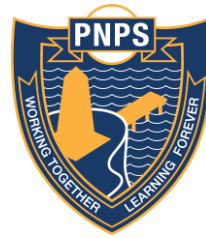
