

English

Spelling: The students participate in spelling swaps, which allows them to learn and study a new sound each week at an appropriate level of learning. The Soundwave program has a phonetic focus, whilst also incorporating vocabulary, word meanings and grammatical knowledge.

The class use the daily 5 model to support literacy skills.

This term the class will focus on producing narrative and creative texts, using literary techniques such as similes, metaphors and personification. Students will also begin to respond to texts, analysing choices made in the writing and language techniques that are used. Students will observe different points of view used in novels and short stories.

Science

Chemical Sciences: Students will use inquiry and investigative skills to explore different states of matter. Students will explore how the states of matter can change and behave differently. The students will undertake investigations and predict changes in matter.

The Arts

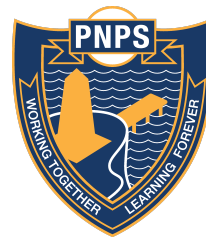
Performing Arts is taught by Miss Scott on Tuesdays.

Technologies

Design Technologies:

Students will research, design and build a sustainable house using recycled materials.

Digital Technologies:

Mathematics

The students participate in Maths swaps which are catered to their appropriate level of learning. The students complete Quick Math or problem solving tasks each lesson to support their understanding and problem solving skills. Our focuses for Term 3 include:

Number and Algebra: To solve multiplication problems with one or two digit numbers.

Measurement and Geometry: To calculate perimeter, area and begin to calculate the volume of 2D and 3D shapes. To measure and compare angles using protractors.

Statistics and Probability: To collect data and display the data using graphs appropriate to the data set.
