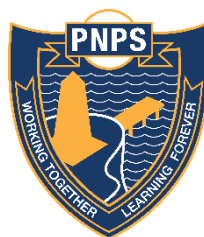
Students are developing skills in the three strands of Language, Literature and Literacy.

Students are responding to a variety of Literature and Persuasive texts, including Multimedia texts.

Specific Reading Comprehension skills studied this Term will include: sequencing, predicting and finding similarities and differences.

The class participates in a Daily 5 program. This involves reading to a partner, listening to a partner read and writing daily. It will also include Spelling where a sound is studied each week. Focus is on phonetic awareness with skills also being developed in word building, word origins, word meanings, vocabulary and grammatical knowledge.

Students will develop their understanding, fluency, reasoning and problem-solving skills of content taught from each of the strands.

Focuses for Term 2 build upon those concepts studied in Term 1 and include;

Number and Algebra- patterns and algebraic skills, integers on number lines, addition and subtraction, fractions and decimals and problem solving involving the four operations.

HASS

History lessons with Mr Letcher occurs alongside studies of Geography and Civics and Citizenship this term.

In **Geography**, Students develop understanding of geographical concepts of place, space, environment, interconnections, sustainability, change and scale. We will investigate and show our understanding of how environmental characteristics influence humans' impact on places.

In **Civics and Citizenship**, students are continuing their own electorates in a 'fantasy' nation and parliament to govern their nation. Students study the key institutions of Australia's democratic government, including state/territory and federal parliaments, and the responsibilities of electors and representatives (government and democracy). Students learn how state/territory and federal laws are made in a parliamentary system (law).
