By using Easy Pay, we can streamline the process of sending permission slips and collecting payments, making it more convenient for both the school and parents. This integrated approach can help ensure that important documents and payments are handled promptly and securely.

We are always seeking to improve our processes at PNPS and continue to strive to reduce the administrative burden and make transactions more convenient for families.

District Athletics was our trial run and was immensely successful achieving 100% permission and payment collection for the event and demonstrated the effectiveness of the Easy Pay system.

We have recently sent all the notifications and permissions for Aquatics in the same way and have been extremely pleased with the process and have received excellent feedback from our school community.

Uniforms, fundraising, school events and Materials and Services charges will continue to be available for payment on the Qkr! app.
